Our Objectives

The objectives of 2 HHH FM Limited as set out in the Constitution are:

- (a) To operate a Community Radio station in Sydney;
- (b) To promote the interests of the residents of the local Hornsby and districts, throughout the local region, in good radio;
- (c) To conduct courses, with or without examinations and to issue certificates, relating to all aspects of radio;
- (d) To promote, join, affiliate with or enter into working arrangements with any body having objectives not incompatible with those of the Association;
- (e) To have regard to the interests of the environment;
- (f) To have regard for objective and balanced radio programming;
- (g) To provide listeners with a range of programs, and without limiting the generality of this objective;
 - i. To provide advice, assistance and benefits on all aspects of radio;
 - ii. To provide production and training or otherwise;
 - iii. To provide all forms of facilities whether in the nature of education, recreation, entertainment, or otherwise;
 - iv. To conduct business of all kinds including sale or lease of any kind of products and services whether in relation to radio or otherwise and to form or promote any company for any such purpose;
 - v. To publish all forms of publications.
- (h) To provide present and former members, employees of and contractors to the Association and the families of such persons with conditions, facilities, and benefits conducive to good working of the Association, and without limiting the generality of this objective to provide for the welfare of such persons whether by way of grants of money or other aid, superannuation or otherwise;
- (i) To aid and support, whether financially, charities and institutions of public character.

Our License Grant

In deciding whether to allocate a community broadcasting licence that is a broadcasting services bands licence to an applicant or to one of a group of applicants, the ACMA is to have regard to:

- a) the extent to which the proposed service or services would meet the existing and perceived future needs of the community within the licence area of the proposed licence; and
- b) the nature and diversity of the interests of that community; and

- (ba) in the case of a community radio broadcasting licence—the extent to which the proposed service or services would provide material of local significance; and
- c) the nature and diversity of other broadcasting services (including national broadcasting services) available within that licence area; and
- d) the capacity of the applicant to provide the proposed service or services; and
- e) the undesirability of one person being in a position to exercise control of more than one community broadcasting licence that is a broadcasting services bands licence in the same licence area; and
- f) the undesirability of the Commonwealth, a State or a Territory or a political party being in a position to exercise control of a community broadcasting licence.

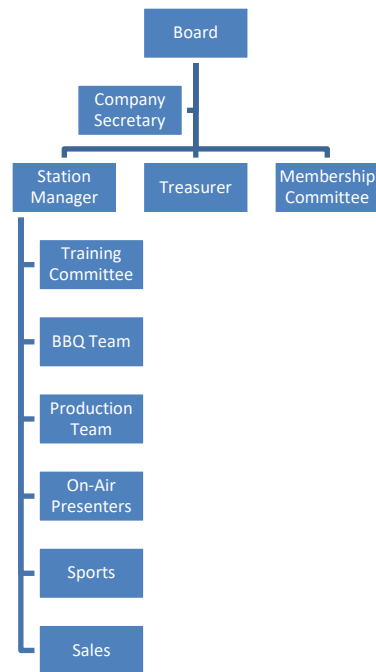

STRUCTURE & MANAGEMENT

2 HHH FM Limited is registered with the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) as a Company Limited by Guarantee.



Function of the Board of Directors

The Constitution sets out in rules 46 and 47 the powers of the Board of Directors, these powers are in addition to and subject to the Corporations Act 2001 (Cwth):

Subject to the Law and to any other provisions of the Constitution, the management and control of the Association and of the business and affairs of the Association shall be vested in the Directors who may exercise all such powers of the Association and do all such acts or things as are not by the Constitution or by the Law expressly required to be exercised or done by the Association in a meeting of members. No rule made or resolution passed by a meeting of members shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if that rule or resolution had not been made or passed.

The Directors of the Association, in exercising any right to appoint or elect one or more persons as a director of any other company, may exercise that right in favour of any person whether a Director or otherwise.

The Role of a Member

2 HHH FM Limited is a Not for Profit Company, Limited by Guarantee.

The members of a company own the company, but the company has a separate legal existence and the company's assets belong to the company.

You can make decisions about the company by passing resolutions, usually at a meeting.

The Annual General Meeting is such a meeting.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Board set out to achieve 4 Key Strategic Objectives this year:

1. Financial Sustainability
2. Programme Quality
3. Community and Stakeholder Engagement; and,
4. Governance

Financial Sustainability

The board has continued to focus on improving the station's financial position, making our finances more dependent on Sponsorship revenue than Grant Funding. Over the past two years the station has seen an improvement of sponsorship revenue of 87% on calendar 2017 for calendar 2019.

This is testament to the decision to take on a Salesperson to handle sponsorship arrangements.

Programme Quality

Programme Quality has continued to improve across the year. We receive feedback from many of our sponsors that they are happy for their brand to be associated with Triple H. The continuous improvement of our programmes is driven by our Presenters, the Station Manager and the Training Committee.

The profile 2 HHH FM Limited delivers to our sponsors has seen 3 of them win Local Business Awards, these sponsors are: Event Cinemas Hornsby; Cherrybrook Travel; and, Homestay Network. Homestay Network attributes its profile in the Hornsby and Ku Ring Gai area to their relationships with local schools and their ongoing involvement with Triple H.

Album of the Week:

One of the initiatives launched by the membership, in particular Graeme Doyle, this year is the Album of the Week. Each week the initiative features a newly released album; it might be from an Australian/AMRAP performer, a contemporary international artist, or a classic/heritage band.

4 voiceovers are recorded and produced to play out ahead of songs from the album via Jazler throughout the weekly grid, and the full album is played on Thursday afternoon and Saturday night.

While it started out with Graeme, Noddy and Rufus presenting the albums, Graeme has been successful in encouraging loads of other Triple H FM members to participate including Mary Wilson, Greg Smith, Sean Hickey, Sharon Masige, Paul Mulgrew, Aranka Nolan, Stephen Holland, and Shamal Tennakoon.

Community and Stakeholder Engagement

Triple H continues to be involved in the lives of the Hornsby and Ku Ring Gai communities. We do this through our specialised language programs, our Breakfast and Drive programs, the sports programming and our specialist music programs. Our major community engagement includes coverage of the Anzac Day service, Battle of the Bands and our live sports coverage.

Governance

To improve our corporate governance, a number of initiatives were undertaken this year. The first was implementing a new Operating Agreement for Presenters while the second was the release of a number of revised policies with the assistance of the CBAA.

To Legal and Regulatory matters, the station had to revert to the constitution lodged and registered at the Australian Securities and Invest Commission (ASIC). This was done as there was no record in the Official Minutes of the organisation replacing the constitution.

The incoming Board must to continue the focus on:

- Financial Sustainability; and,
- Programme Quality

The Board and the Treasure have determined that all members are entitled to view the accounts of Triple H on request to the Treasurer.

The detailed Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet reports follow. In summary:

- Grant admin and production was down 36%
- Net fundraising was up 17%
- Membership was down 20%
- Sponsorship was up 20%
- Presenter fees were up 8%

Expenses were 2% adjusting for asset revaluation.

Our taxable profit for the year is \$8,496. Accumulated losses from previous years means we have no tax due.

Notes to the financial statements:

1. Grants. The line in the income section called "Grant Admin and production" is the amount of the grants that accrues to Triple H.

2. There was a lag between paying for our new studio equipment and delivery which will see a large asset revaluation in the 2020 accounts, followed by a balancing asset write off. We could not take advantage of the asset write off scheme in 2019 because we had not accepted delivery of the equipment in the 2019 financial year.

3. The current ratio is distorted by the John Lee Scholarship program (\$7107.50) being coded as a Current Liability

The Triple H FM Training Committee continued to deliver positive outcomes for the radio station during the 2018/2019 financial year through quality learning programs and associated materials.

During this period, a total of 9 new trainees undertook the Presenter Training Course. Over 50% of these are now on air with their own programs, with the remainder at various stages of submitting program applications to be approved for airtime.

At the time of enrolment, all trainees were new members to Triple H FM and have since this time contributed to the station over and beyond presenting their programs, through involvement at fundraising events, outside broadcasts and the like.

Since the formation of the current Training Committee, a total of 33 students have undertaken the presenter training course with an 85% success rate of those completing the course who have then gone on to present a program on the station. As a result, there is currently some 21 hours of live to air programming each week, which is presented by graduates of the presenter training course.

The remainder of 2019 will see the Training Committee deliver a series of Skills Booster sessions for existing presenters, covering topics such as Jazler, Media Law, Interview Techniques and Program Preparation. These sessions, each of which requiring a small commitment of time from presenters (90 minutes approx.) will continue to deliver a professional standard of on-air presentation, which is critical to Triple H FM's survival in a competitive Sydney radio market in attracting and retaining listeners, members and sponsors.

Interviews:

On a weekly basis, Triple H programs do on average at least 10 interviews per week. On a monthly basis, over 40 interviews are done bringing guests into the Triple H studio and some interviews are done via the phone. Looking at an annual basis, that is estimated to be nearly 500 interviews.

All interviews raise awareness of Triple H and can be published on social media to raise the profile of the station. The interviews are published in a Google Document, shared on the Triple H presenters page and presenters are encouraged to register each interview.

SPORTS TEAM

Summary

The year in Sports on Radio 2HHH-FM was marked by a number of breakthroughs – particularly with the broadcast of Women's Sports, the development of female broadcasters, and the opening year of a dedicated sports podcast program.

Following on from the clear – and correct – directive of the HHH-FM Board Of Directors that Women's Sport be given more attention given the increased profile and quality of Women's Sport across Australia, the HHH Sports Team was delighted to give live calls of both of the Sydney Women's First Grade T20 Cricket Cup Grand Finals that were played in the 2019 Calendar Year.

As a bonus, both of those deciders involved our own local Northern District "Lady Rangers". Whilst the Lady Rangers fell short in both deciders (to near neighbours and arch rivals Gordon on the 2018/19 decider in January before going down to Combined Universities in the 2019/20 Grand Final in November), the exposure of both the local outfit and Women's Sport was greatly appreciated by senior officials from all clubs concerned.

The other exciting development was the inclusion of talented broadcasters Alex Bellamy and Sarah Marschke to the Sports Team in 2019. Both of these outstanding young women brought a fresh and unique perspective (as current players in their respective sports of Rugby Union and Australian Rules Football) to the 2HHH winter Sports coverage.

These extra additions will go a long way to completing the clear goal of commencing a Women's Version of the regular weekly Friday Night program "The Bench" on the 2HHH Program Schedule during 2020. This will also lead to 2HHH being a continuing leader with a point of difference in Community Sports Broadcasting in Sydney as no other Community station has the regular presence – let alone the numbers, depth and potential growth – that the 2HHH team now has.

My deepest thanks to Keith Topolski who – despite following his commercial path to 5CC in Port Lincoln, SA mid-year – still continues to contribute from afar. This is especially so with the 'Splinters' podcast – which was the idea that he and Mat Meers pushed for from the time 'The Bench' commenced on 2HHH 18 months ago.

It would be remiss of me not to give a very special thank you to departing Station Manager Rick Dunlop for his support of sport – and of the live calls, "The Bench" and 'Splinters' in particular – during his time in the position. It is not far-fetched to say that without Rick's support at critical flashpoint moments over his time at HHH, sport would not have had the success it has enjoyed over the last 9 years. I am glad (despite the hopes of some in the 2HHH tent) that he will not be totally lost to 2HHH going forward.

My thanks also go to outgoing Chairman Brian Fulmer, General Manager Ray Agostino and the Board of Magpies Waitara for their financial and moral support of sport this year and over the last 5 years they have given that support.

Without that support, there would be no sport on 2HHH and no relationship with the station at all – a relationship that is leveraged upon by those who have nothing to do with sport right down to holding today's AGM at the Magpies Waitara Club.

The Sports Team have firmly strived to be the best we can be for the betterment of the station, the connections we make with the local communities of Hornsby and Ku Ring Gai through our sports broadcasts, and our desire to produce good quality radio for the enjoyment of all listeners.

The Bench

"The Bench" consolidated its place on the weekly program during the last 12 months with regular topical interviews and segments to be a pillar of the 2HHH schedule – with the Rangers now contributing a weekly guest during the summer months to complement the guests from the Asquith Magpies and Hornsby Lions during the year.

However, the staple backbone of HHH Sport – the live broadcasts of Asquith Magpies Rugby League, Belrose Eagles Rugby League and Northern District Rangers T20 Cricket home games – continued for a ninth season since the 'Sunday Live' format commenced in 2010.

This led to the consolidation of 2HHH as one of Sydney's premier vehicles of Community Sports Broadcasting in 2019 as other community stations in an increasingly competitive field as other Community Radio Stations (such as SWR99.9FM, Hawkesbury Radio and Alive 96.5FM) increase their sports content.
